- 1. The facilitator for this meeting was the Camp Operations Officer.
- 2. The following offices in attendance were per enclosure (1).
- 3. The following agenda items were discussed, per the enclosure (2).
- a. Significant events calendar. The calendar was reviewed and over the course of the meeting, the below events were highlighted for the month of November, per enclosure (3).
 - (1) The Kinser Elementary School Fall Carnival was rescheduled for 3 November.
 - (2) Trunk-or-Treat was rescheduled for 5 November.
 - (3) The following MCCS events were highlighted:
 - (a) Family Game Night at the Kinser Library on 4 November from 1700-1900.
- (b) Semper Fit Half Marathon on 19 November, beginning at 0800. Pre-registration fee is \$30; same-day registration is \$40.
- (c) School-Age Center and Youth and Teen Center will be holding a Davy of Thanks and Thankfulness events on 22 November.
 - (d) Surfside Club will be providing Thanksgiving Meals To-Go on 23 November.
- (e) Surfside Club will be holding a Thanksgiving Meal Buffet on 23 November from 1100-1500.
- (4) The camp will be hosting units from the Western Army, Japanese Ground Self Defense Force, in support of Exercise Chinzei 29 from 30 October through 17 November.
- (a) A Logistics Exercise will be executed from 31 October through 2 November at building 300 and the Headquarters Regiment Unit Marshalling Area. The camp is providing billeting and messing for the 11 participants. On 31 October, Rear Admiral Kondo, Director General Logistics, Japan Joint Staff, will observe the exercise.
- (b) A reconnaissance exercise will be executed from 11 through 17 November at the landing zone by the theatre. A total of 24 personnel will be participating. The camp is providing

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messing and training space. On 13 November, Major General Harada, Commanding General 15th Brigade, will observe the exercise.

- b. The 30-60-90 day outlook was reviewed.
- c. Tenant organizations briefed their current initiatives and concerns, per enclosure (2).
- 3. Outputs from the meeting were:

a. Camp Operations

- (1) Regarding Kinser Festival:
- (a) Provide the Kinser Festival Traffic plan to tenant units so that they can plan to minimize impact on operations during the course of the event.
- (b) Determine location of Automated Message Handling System tasking in support of Kinser Festival and coordinate to get the tasking sent to required units.
- (c) Due to Kinser Festival's postponement/cancellation, these products will not be sent to tenants.
- (3) Provide a copy of the Memorandum of Agreement in regards to bachelor housing management to tenant S-4 chiefs.

b. Facilities Chief

- (1) Provide an updated Gantt timeline to tenants for construction aboard Camp Kinser.
- (2) Coordinate with Marine Corps Installations Pacific, GF, to provide infrastructure reset analysis results to tenants. Coordinate a brief to explain the outputs and what this means for tenants in the future.
 - c. Environmental requested to reschedule an in-call with the Camp Commander.
- d. The Camp Kinser Exchange requested assistance with informing residents regarding upcoming changes to the 7-day and Exchange hours.
- e. The Chaplain requested additional assistance in getting volunteers for the Mothers of Pre-Schoolers Program.
- 4. The following requests for information were submitted by tenants:
 - a. Regarding barracks 1210:
- (1) What is the cost of the asbestos abatement in barracks 1210? During construction, asbestos containing materials (ACM) were found in the walls throughout the entire building. Currently, there is not cost estimate, but it was reported during a project meeting that the project was seeking prioryear funds. Instead of waiting for prior year funds, construction will resume immediately and the

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contractor will submit a Request for Equitable Adjustment (REA) after completion of the asbestos mitigation. This will save time.

- (2) What is an accurate timeline for the renovation to be completed? The construction completion date is tentatively 15 September 2018. The asbestos mitigation has resumed immediately. There is nothing else that can be done to speed up the project.
 - b. Regarding the Installation Reset:
- (1) What is the estimated timeline for completing updates to iNFADS? On 1 January 2018 data entry into iNFADS from the installation reset analysis will be complete. iNFADS is a database that contains space utilization and assignments, mission dependency index, and the facility condition index. The database uses this data to align building codes and provides a means to prioritize renovations based upon the codes.
- (2) When will tenants be able to receive briefing regarding impacts of infrastructure reset on their facility usage? Tenants are to assume that there will be no impact on their facility usage. If an installation reset project is planned that may impact a space, tenants will be notified at least 2 years before the start of construction.
- 4. Due-ins for the next meeting are:
 - a. Awareness campaign for MOPS.
 - b. Information sharing plan for UEM program and energy initiative.
 - c. UEM program involvement campaign plan.
- d. The Bongo main server for Camp Kinser is located in Barracks 1399, which is due for a renovation. Camp Kinser needs to determine a new location and plan for movement of server.
- e. Building 506, bay 1, has had a leak in the fire suppression system that has taken over one year to repair. Camp Kinser operations will work with Facilities Engineering to determine why the work request has taken so long to address.


